San Juan de la Arena (Asturias) Spain, july 16 2014, on still standing stems of *Phragmites australis*.

Pseudothecia (I think the asci could be bitunicate) scattered, inmersed, small (up to 0.2 mm), blackish, pyriform, only the neck (ostiolate?) protruding over the epidermis of the host.

Asci broadly fusiform, 8-spored, up to 110 x 20-25 μm , very shortly stipitate, IKI negative

Pseudoparaphyses present.

Ascospores broadly fusoid, olive-brownish, pseudoseptate, with a broad gel covering at least inside the asci, maybe vertuculose, $22.6-25.6 \times 8.9-9.9 \ \mu m$
